GRADING

This class is graded according to the CCTE and Fine Art Common Core Standards. Individual projects may be graded on 2-7 different standards. As a result, one missing project could drastically decrease your overall grade. Each standard will be graded a minimum of three times. You should see growth in these grades, meaning your scores on these standards at the end of the semester, should be greater than they were at the beginning. If a student shows considerable growth, early grades may be dropped at the teacher's discretion. If you feel you qualify for this, please come see me near the end of the semester. You are expected to be an advocate for your learning. Stay on top of your grades and missing assignments by checking Skyward and our website often. If you are struggling with a concept or technique, please use your resources including our website, your peers, or myself. According to standards based grading, to receive a 4 on a standard, you must find your own way to show your understanding of the standard, by going above and beyond expectations.

Critiques

Critiquing artwork is a large part of this class. You will be expected to give and take constructive criticism of your artwork, and the artwork of your peers. Participation is required. You will be assessed on your ability to critique using the responding process.

Projects

We will work on a number of projects throughout the semester. Projects range from daily sketchbook activities to digital and technical drawing.

Writing Samples

You will complete a writing sample at the beginning, middle and end of the semester. Writing samples are used to show progress and growth throughout the semester, regarding your ability to respond to art.

Professionalism

Your grade will reflect your ability to participate on a daily basis, and have a professional work ethic. This includes participation in group discussions, critiques, and studio days. Maintaining deadlines, a clean and safe work environment, and being supportive of others is also included.

- + Students that leave class often, or for long periods of time, will not meet the Professionalism standard.
- + Students who use their phones or chromebooks irresponsibly or at inappropriate times, will not meet the Professionalism standard.
- + Students who exhibit disrespectful behavior, will not meet the Professionalism standard.



BEHAVIOR: The art studio is an inclusive learning environment. Due to the personal nature of art, some students may feel uncomfortable sharing their work. To ensure all students feel safe and secure in our classroom, student behavior is an important factor. Hateful, malicious, inconsiderate or otherwise rude behavior will not be tolerated. If you experience this behavior from a peer, please don't hesitate to let me know. If a student is found to be participating in unacceptable behavior, the guardian of that student will be notified immediately. It is expected that you follow school and classroom rules at all times. Students who violate these rules may be asked to fill out a **Restorative Justice** Form.

PLAGIARISM: If you turn in work that is not your own, you will get a zero for the assignment and zero for Professionalism for the unit. Your parent/guardian will be contacted.

Unethical behavior that would result in disapline in the workplace will result in consequeces that could impact your grade. Please refere to the Professionalism Rubric.

SAFETY: Keep your work area clean and free of **tripping hazards**, including cords. All backpacks should be put in the designated areas. **Sharp tools** including exacto knives, printmaking tools, paper cutter, etc. require a safety test and permission prior to use. Art rooms can be messy! Please make sure **clothing**, **hairstyles and jewelry** are appropriate. No loose items that could cause danger to yourself or others. **Sprays** and particulates, including some paints, fixatives, solvents and chemicals that are harmful to the body need special permission to be used, and need to be used at a spray booth or outdoors with appropriate protective gloves, glasses and masks. **Emergency Drills** will be conducted regularly to address weather and emergency scenarios. In case of an emergency, students should exit the building on the southeast side, and meet in the field near the bus dropoff. The **First Aid Kit** is located on the wall beside the teacher's desk. Any student experiencing **serious emergencies** should immediately call 911 and notify proper school authorities. All CCTE Certified teachers are trained in First Aid and CPR. Minor injuries can be dealt with in class with a follow-up with a school nurse or medical professional.

ABSENCES: You are required to make up all missed work. If you are absent, you are responsible for checking our website or Google Classroom, and checking in with me. If it is a pre-arranged absence, such as a school function or planned vacation, please notify me as soon as possible for make-up materials. The work will be due the day you return to class, unless specified otherwise.

LATE WORK: You will be given due dates for assignments at the introduction of a project. You are required to turn in the assignment by the specified date. If you do not have completed projects for critique days, you will not be given full credit for critique participation. You can revise your work based on class critiques, and turn it in for a revised grade before the semester's final turn in day. S1: January 10th S2: May 7th.
